Communication panels installed in play areas to support inclusive play

Vibrant communication panels have been installed at forty play areas in Kettering, Corby and Wellingborough to support all users of play areas and open spaces.

These colourful boards feature simple visual cues to help children express emotions and needs like 'happy', 'sad', 'hungry' and 'tired'. They include communication tools such as yes/no responses, pronouns, questions, numbers and letters - making play more inclusive and accessible. More on this story

Council issues reminder: Fines for environmental offences increased

The Council is reminding residents that fines for fly-tipping, littering, graffiti and other environmental offences have increased as of late 2024.
