As part of the anniversary, the council is thanking the many people and organisations who have contributed to its progress, including residents, businesses, staff, councillors, parish and town councils, voluntary and community groups, and partner agencies.

Building on strong foundations established since its creation on 1 April 2021, the council remains dedicated to working with local communities to make North Northamptonshire the very best it can be.

State-of-the-art skatepark opened in Wellingborough

I was delighted to attend the official opening of the new skatepark at Bassett's Close Park in Wellingborough last week.

The new state-of-the-art facility replaces the much-loved older skatepark that needed updating. The project includes new solar lighting and CCTV.

It forms part of wider improvements across the park, including upgraded surfacing, expanded play areas and new outdoor gym equipment.

Following feedback from residents, the skatepark has been relocated to a more visible part of the park, providing a safe, modern space for wheeled sports – supporting active, healthy communities and offering an alternative to street skating.

The project was funded through S106 and capital contributions, delivered with support from partners across the council and the community.

Partnership in action: A14 clean-Up for the Great British Spring Clean

National Highways supported this year's [Great British Spring Clean](#) with a series of clean-ups along the A14 in North Northamptonshire.

The annual Keep Britain Tidy campaign, held from 13 to 29 March, encourages communities across the UK to take part in litter-picking to improve public spaces such as roadsides, streets, parks and beaches.

National Highways organised community litter-picks, night-time sweeps and staff volunteer sessions as part of the effort. Working alongside council teams, they helped keep this key route through North Northamptonshire clean and safe.

Roadside litter poses risks to drivers, pollutes the environment and harms wildlife, making this work absolutely vital. I would urge everyone to always take their rubbish home with them.

Continued support for the Deaf community in Northamptonshire

North Northamptonshire Council and West Northamptonshire Council have appointed [RJ Community CIC](#) to run a new service to support the Deaf community in Northamptonshire.

The move follows the closure of Deafconnect at the end of March.

RJ Community CIC supports Deaf, Deafblind and people with hearing loss to access information, advocacy, training and community activities in Deaf-accessible ways, including British Sign Language (BSL).

The organisation focuses on improving access to services, reducing isolation, and promoting independence, inclusion and wellbeing.

Free drop-in vaccination clinics this Easter for young people in Years 8 to 13

Three free drop-in vaccination clinics will run across North Northamptonshire during the Easter break for young people in Years 8 to 13.

Parents and carers are encouraged to ensure their children are fully vaccinated against serious illnesses, including HPV-related cancers, meningitis, septicaemia, measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria and polio. Anyone missing one or more vaccinations is advised to attend. Staff can check on the day whether a child has already received the vaccinations.

No appointment is needed. Families can attend any clinic location, date or time listed.

- Tuesday 7 April: 4:30pm to 6:30pm at Glamis Hall (Goldsmith Rd, Wellingborough NN8 3RU).
- Thursday 9 April: 10am to 2pm at Kingsway Centre (130 Kingsway, Wellingborough NN8 2EN).
- Friday 10 April: 1pm to 3:30pm at Melton Community Centre (Melton St, Kettering NN16 9DH).

NHS Healthy Start scheme: Get help to buy healthy food and milk

If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under four-years-old, you may be entitled to help to buy healthy food and milk.

If you're eligible, you'll be sent a Healthy Start card with money on it that you can use in some UK shops. Your benefit will be added onto this card every four weeks.

You can use your card to:

- Buy milk, fruit and vegetables, pulses and infant formula milk.
- Collect Healthy Start vitamins to support you during pregnancy and breastfeeding and/or vitamin drops for babies and children under four-years-old.

Historical objects from 1904 discovered in Kettering Library roof

Several historical objects were discovered in the roof of the Grade II listed [Kettering Library and Alfred East Gallery](#) during the renovation project.

The artefacts were likely discarded by construction workers during the library's initial building in 1904, and include:

- Empty box of Bryant and May's Pearl Matches,
- Wrigley's Chewing Gum wrapper,

- Miller & Cooke bottle with the original stopper,
- London Tape container lid and
- Empty pack of Senior Service cigarettes.

They are now being cared for by our Museum and Gallery Team, with a possible view to show the items as part of a future exhibition.
