Chairs appointed for £20 million Pride in Place Neighbourhood Boards



I'm pleased to share that Chairs have now been appointed to lead three new Neighbourhood Boards delivering the £20 million Government-funded [Pride in Place Programme](#) across the local area.

Gail Lewis will chair the Avondale Grange Board (Kettering), Nicky Kingsnorth will lead the Queensway Board (Wellingborough), and Alex Bonner will chair the Kingswood, Hazel Leys and Exeter Board (Corby).

These voluntary roles bring together people with strong local connections to work alongside MPs, councillors, partners, community representatives and residents. Together, they will help shape a long-term vision and regeneration plans that reflect local priorities and guide investment over the next decade.

This programme is all about strengthening our communities through collaboration and targeted funding, and I look forward to seeing the positive impact it will deliver.

Submit your Expression of Interest: Crisis Resilience Fund



We are inviting voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations across North Northamptonshire to apply for funding through the UK Government's Crisis Resilience Fund.

Over the next three years, the council will receive £13.18 million to strengthen long-term financial resilience, reduce hardship and support vulnerable households.

We are looking for Expressions of Interest to deliver Financial Resilience Services (£500,000) and Community Coordination (£680,000), alongside existing Crisis and Housing Payments.

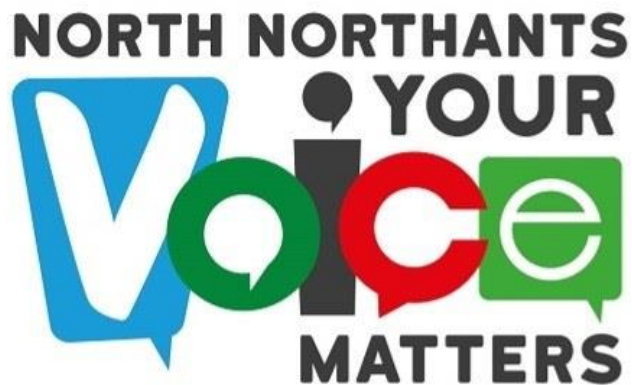
