Kettering and Wellingborough to get food waste collections

Residents in the Kettering and Wellingborough areas will soon receive their food waste caddies as we prepare to introduce weekly food waste collections this autumn.

Each household will be provided with two caddies: a small kitchen caddy for collecting food waste indoors and a larger outdoor caddy for collection day. Alongside the delivery, residents will receive information explaining how the service will work and what food waste items can be recycled.

I would encourage residents to look out for their caddies and take some time to read the information provided. However, please remember not to put food waste caddies out for collection just yet. The collection start date will be confirmed closer to the launch of the service.

This new service is another important step in helping us increase recycling rates, reduce waste and support our ambition for a cleaner, greener and more sustainable North Northamptonshire.

Stay safe and help reduce wildfire risk this summer

Wildfire risk remains extremely high following the recent period of hot, dry weather, and I would urge residents to take extra care to help protect our communities, countryside and green spaces.

Residents are reminded that a temporary ban on the sale of disposable barbecues is in place and should avoid activities that could start a fire, including the use of disposable barbecues, campfires, fireworks and the careless disposal of cigarettes.

We continue to work closely with Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service and other partners to promote fire prevention and protect our communities.

With little significant rainfall forecast, everyone has a role to play in preventing wildfires and keeping North Northamptonshire safe.
